General Behavioral Guidelines

- You cannot leave the event/hotel premises without informing a mentor and being accompanied by an adult chaperone.
- Follow the rules and guidelines of the venue (including COVID-19 related rules and guidelines)
- Be courteous to the venue and other attendees -- **DO NOT** leave your trash behind after lunch, in the stands, etc.
- We highly encourage you to tour the pits and talk to other teams to learn about different robots, outreach efforts, team structures, etc.

Bottom Line: The expectation is that you behave in a ***professional*** manner. Do not behave in any way(s) that you would not behave in the presence of your parents, PG's teachers and administrators, or our team sponsors.

Additional Behavioral Guidelines

At the Competition

- Be courteous towards other teams and event attendees
 - No horseplaying
 - No trash-talking of any kind

At the Hotel

- Curfew: 10 pm
 - All students WILL be in their rooms by 10:00 PM.
- Be courteous towards the other hotel guests
 - No horseplaying/loud noises

Dress Code

- All team members must follow [PGHS' Dress Code/Grooming Guidelines](#) (page 41).
- Additional guidelines:
 - All team members are expected to wear official Team 2073 merchandise on competition days (excludes practice days)
 - Here is a list of acceptable Team 2073 merchandise:
 - Dri-Fit shirts (from 2017 forward)*
 - Cotton Tees (new logo shirts are preferred (\$10), but old logo shirts are accepted)*
 - Team long-sleeve shirts, polo shirts, sweatshirts, and hats that have our team logo
 - Students are not allowed to trade Dri-Fit shirts (It is OK to trade cotton tees)
 - Closed-toe shoes must be worn at all times
 - **No clothing articles of any kind representing another team may be worn during the competition.**

*Dri-Fits and Cotton Tees are preferred on the last day of competition for Team Pictures.

Rules for Scouting Team

- **If you are a Scouter, you have been notified of your assigned position and shifts.**
- Scouter Responsibilities and Duties:
 - Pay diligent attention to the matches and teams that you are scouting
 - Enter as accurate of data as possible into the scouting apps
 - If you need to leave your seat, make sure you ask someone to cover the match(es) and team(s) you're supposed to scout

Consequences

- The team mentors and on-site adult chaperones reserve the authority to determine if a student's behavior(s) violate any of the rules and guidelines.

 - Severe consequences may include, but are not limited to:
 - A bus trip home at the expense of the team member, or
 - Dismissal from the team
